#### 2 Corinthians 5:14-19

For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again. So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer.

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them.

Isaiah 43:18-19 "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.

#### **GIVE THANKS**

•The year you just have lived...with the good and the bad was a gift from God. Be grateful for the gift of life.

#### **REVIEW THE YEAR**

 Ask God to reveal to you the key moments of significance. People, conversations, trials, victories...if you journal regularly or use a devotional, spend time reviewing it and ask God to point out areas of significance.

#### FACE YOUR SHORTCOMINGS

•Acknowledge and confront areas where you've fallen short, in your life and within yourself (both action and thought). Write them down. Perhaps share with a trusted friend.

# LOOK FORWARD TO THE FUTURE - Ask where you need Gods wisdom, strength, and power in the year to come.
